GENERAL PROCEDURE ORDER NUMBER 2005-8

THIS MATTER arises *sua sponte*, to shorten the Fed.R.Bankr.P. 2002(a)(1) notice period for 11 U.S.C. § 341 Meetings of Creditors for certain cases filed from October 6 through October 16, 2005. Cause exists to shorten the notice period pursuant to Fed.R.Bankr.P. 9006(c) based upon the volume of new bankruptcy cases filed the week of October 10, 2005 and corresponding delay in issuing the notices for certain Section 341 meetings.

In those cases where the Section 341 meeting notice was shortened, the Court will give additional consideration to requests for Fed.R.Bankr.P. 2004 examinations and modest extensions of deadlines to object to exemptions or to file complaints to determine discharge or dischargeability of debts. Further, upon good cause shown, the Court will consider issuing an amended Section 341 meeting notice with a new meeting date, however, the original deadlines for complaints to determine discharge or dischargeability of debts will not be changed absent specific motion and order granting the same. Accordingly,

THE COURT ORDERS that pursuant to Fed.R.Bankr.P. 9006(c), the required notice period set forth in Fed.R.Bankr.P. 2002(a)(1) is hereby shortened in those bankruptcy cases commenced from October 6 through October 16, 2005 that were mailed with fewer than twenty three (23) days between the date of mailing until the Section 341 meeting date.
