

MOTIONS TO DISMISS/SUMMARY JUDGMENT/DISPOSITIVE MOTIONS

In an effort to secure the just, speedy and inexpensive determination of every adversary proceeding and contested matter, this Court has joined with Judges Brooks and Tallman in adopting an Amended Standing Order Re: Dispositive Motion Practice Standards in Adversary Proceedings and Contested Matters. All parties are advised to review this Standing Order before filing any motions. Failure to comply with this Standing Order may result in a denial of the filed motion.

Replies to responses to dispositive motions may only be filed upon leave of court.

Parties are to provide a copy to chambers of any dispositive motion, response or reply that exceeds thirty (30) pages in length (including exhibits). The copy should be clearly marked as a "courtesy copy."
