**Bankruptcy Petition Preparers (“BPPs”)**

Sometimes debtors engage non-attorneys to assist them in filing bankruptcy. These non-attorneys are referred to as BPPs. Section 110 of the Bankruptcy Code severely limits the types of services that BPPs may provide. In general, they may not give legal advice and can only provide forms and typing services.
